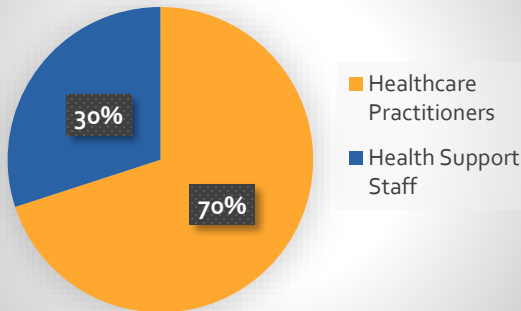

FAST FACTS

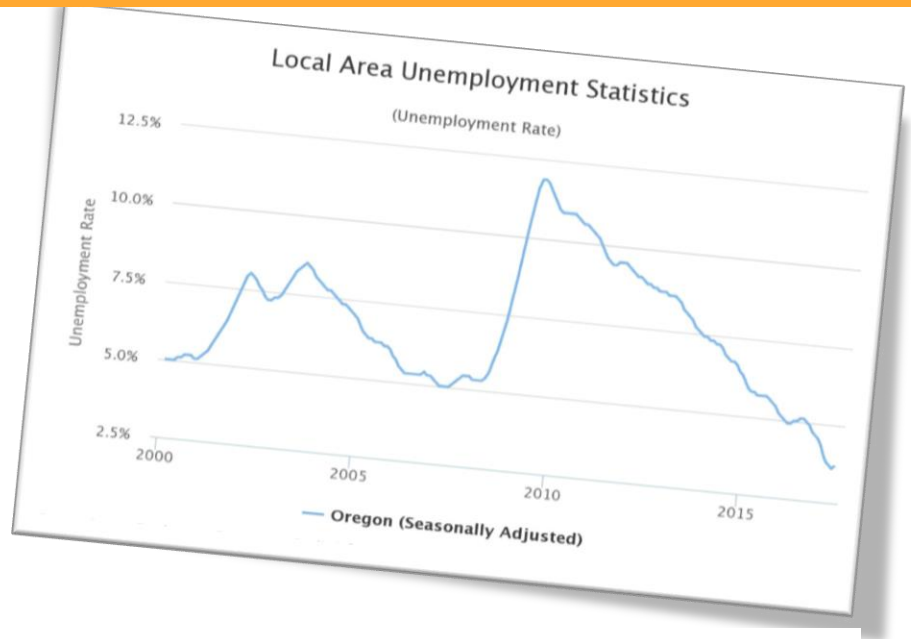
By 2024 health care occupations are expected to grow
