Using bioethical principles as a lens, she will examine the complex ethical challenges that accompany pandemics, including the allocation of scarce resources and principles of equity in caring for these patients.



Molly Osborne, M.D., PhD

Dr. Osborne is Professor of Medicine in the Pulmonary and Critical Care Division, Oregon Health & Science University (OHSU) and Integrated Ethics Program Officer, VA Portland Health Care System (VAPORHCS.) She was Associate Dean of Student Affairs from 1997-2015 and remains in leadership positions at both the Veterans Administration and the American Thoracic Society (ATS). More recently she has collaborated on graphic narrative vignettes and teaching tools for medical bioethics, with two publications in the *Annals of Internal Medicine*. The success of this graphic narrative method of education has led to multiple presentations at OHSU, the Statewide Kinsman Conference, Penn State, and the OHSU Educators Collaborative. With her international collaborators, she has a book contract from Penn State University Press to create eight original graphic narratives tentatively entitled *Graphic Ethics*.
